Facts and Figures January to March 2024

Our quarterly report to BedsRCC for January to March showed that we continue to hit more than 1000 jobs per quarter, thanks to a great team of volunteers!

During these first three months of 2024 we helped 159 residents with a total of 873 jobs. When we add on the help and support given to other professionals and organisations, including the delivery of 5900 Town Criers to Houghton Hall Ward, Bidwell West and Linmere by 22 volunteers, the total is 1037.

Befriending visits and phone calls and shopping is high, mainly due to the increase in food bank collections for families with several children, and additional clients now getting regular fortnightly shopping.

Volunteers delivered 32 Warm in Winter Bags (donated by the charity, Small Acts of Kindness) to older residents and 24 Packs of Support (donated by Community Link) to residents struggling with cost of living.



We currently have 46 volunteers signed up with Houghton Regis

Helpers and we thank you all for your goodwill, generosity of time and the care and commitment you give to the community.

Presentation of The King's Award for Voluntary Service

On 18 April 2024 we were honoured to be presented with The King's Award for Voluntary Service by His Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, Susan Lousada, at a celebration event in the Memorial Hall in Houghton Regis.

Seventy guests attended the presentation, including volunteers, invited dignitaries and representatives from community and other organisations with whom we work in partnership.

Welcomed by our Chair, Yvonne, the Lord-Lieutenant first presented the Certificate, speaking about the dedicated team of volunteers and the difference they have made to the community especially during and post-Covid. She spoke about the King's Award being awarded to voluntary groups that are truly outstanding and that Houghton Regis Helpers <u>are</u> truly outstanding.



Susan Lousada particularly commented that, as a Good Neighbour Scheme, Houghton Regis Helpers help all age profiles with over 50% of those helped being of working age, that we are all volunteers with no paid staff and not only respond to requests from residents but also from other professionals . She closed her speech by saying we are a shining light in our County. On presenting the Certificate to the Chair, Susan Lousada read out the inscription, signed personally by King Charles the Third, awarded to *'Houghton Regis Helpers for providing practical support and wellbeing whilst reducing loneliness and isolation in Houghton Regis'*

Following the presentation of the Certificate we were presented with an engraved Crystal, held aloft by Yvonne!

Jenny as Secretary, gave the response speech, thanking the Lord-Lieutenant for this prestigious award which is an honour and testament to the hard work of all our



volunteers, past and present. Jenny thanked everyone for joining us to help celebrate this achievement, particularly those who nominated Houghton Regis Helpers, wrote letters of support and gave testimonies on our behalf.



Guests included the assessment team of Deputy Lord-Lieutenants Rob Oakley, Ismail Anilmis and Mark Hardy; The High Sheriff of Bedfordshire, Bav Shah; Town Mayor Cllr Jimmy

Carroll; Tracey Inkster from Central Beds Council who nominated us and Sharon Warboys from Don't Let Dunstable Die who wrote a letter of support. Representatives from Houghton Regis Town Council, Beds RCC, Titan PCN, Small Acts of Kindness, Time2Connect, CBC Ward Councillors and staff, the Heritage Society and Memorial Hall, and local religious groups attended - but the Volunteers and their guests were the STARS. Everyone enjoyed a celebration lunch and meeting the Lord-Lieutenant, who spent time going round the tables and chatting to everyone.


